

## LOCAL CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

### **COLLEGE OF THE ALBEMARLE**

2023

#### **OVERVIEW**

This local Articulation Agreement details the options and requirements designed to provide students with a seamless process joining secondary and postsecondary Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs of study. For all offerings, please utilize the information on the COA Website for the most up-to-date information.

#### I. Articulated credit for High School Courses – Pages 3 - 7

This agreement is comprised of high school CTE Courses that match the knowledge and skills taught in similar College of The Albemarle (COA) courses. The Articulation Agreement ensures that if a student is proficient in the high school courses, then the student can receive college credit for that course offered at COA. This agreement streamlines the student's educational pathway by eliminating the need to take multiple courses with the same learning outcomes.

To receive articulated credit, the student must enroll in a community college within two years of their high school graduation date and must have a grade of B or higher in the course. COA does not offer every program and/or course listed.

#### II. Career and College Promise CTE Pathways - Pages 8 - 14

High school students who enroll in a Career and College Promise (CCP) pathway may earn articulated college credits as described in this agreement while enrolled in high school if the CTE articulated college credit is part of their CCP Pathway and the following criteria are met:

- Students must be a junior or senior.
- Students must have a 2.8 unweighted GPA <u>or</u> demonstrate college readiness on an approved assessment <u>or</u> have the recommendation of the high school principal.
- Students must be making progress toward high school graduation.
- Students must meet course prerequisites and admission requirements.

To maintain eligibility, student must:

- Continue to make progress toward high school graduation.
- Meet the college's academic progress policy for all students.
