FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Camp Scrubs?

Camp Scrubs is a hands-on learning experience for prospective health science students that gives them the opportunity to explore the different Health Science programs available at COA.

What is the benefit of attending Camp Scrubs?

Prospective health science students will get a better idea of what area of health science best suits their needs and goals.

What is the charge for Camp Scrubs?

There is a \$30 fee. Plus students will be required to purchase scrubs.

What are the dates of Camp Scrubs and how many students will be accepted?

Camp Scrubs is offered June 15-18, 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Students will get a break and snack midmorning. There will be awards and a picnic on the last day. 30 high school students from the surrounding areas will be accepted to attend the Boot Camp.

How are students accepted into Camp Scrubs?

Students will need to complete the application on the back of this brochure and have it signed by an instructor or guidance counselor to show they are in good standing with their attendance. The form can be emailed, faxed or mailed to Mary Blackburn no later than May 15, 2026. Once accepted, students will receive an acceptance letter and instructions
