MEDICAL & HEALTH OCCUPATION CLASSES**Cardiovascular Technician/Monitor****ICV-3111A****49609**

This course is designed and approved to prepare the student to become a certified EKG (ECG) and Technician/Monitor. The course will cover the anatomy and physiology of the heart, principles of EKG, dysrhythmia recognition of sinus, junctional/atrial rhythms, heart blocks and bundle branches and ventricular ectopy rhythms. Skills will include operating EKG equipment, running and mounting strips as well as reading and interpreting 22 types of cardiac lead tracings produced from 12 and five lead monitors and to understand the basics of capnography as it relates to heart function. No clinical. Book required. **Prerequisites: High school diploma or GED and reading placement test score or college level English.**

EMT**EMS-4200A**

This course is designed to enable the successful student to earn a certificate in Emergency Medicine. This course will guide you on the right path towards a career as an Emergency Medical Technician.

Prerequisites:

- ❖ Must be at least 17 years of age. High School students who are under 18 years of age may have to complete a minor release form.
- ❖ Complete the current reading and writing assessment test and score basic reading comprehension at the eleventh grade level.
 - Students producing an official high school transcript or college transcript illustrating successful completion of a college-level English course are exempt from the reading and writing assessment.
- ❖ Submit the enclosed Medical Evaluation Record with physical exam and immunization records including proof of:
 - Hepatitis A & B (3 dose series or titer)
 - Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap)
 - Measles, Mumps, Rubella (2 Dose Series)
 - Varicella (2 dose or immune titer)
 - Annual TB test. (If TB test results are positive, documentation must be provided from a physician clearing work in the healthcare field.)
- ❖ Pay the continuing education registration fee. Current fee is **\$180**. (Fee exemptions apply to individuals affiliated with qualified agencies/organizations. Please see the EMS Director to find out if you qualify. If fee exempt, the student must provide an exemption letter from the Agency Director stating that they are an active member. That letter must be presented to COA at the time of registration.)
- ❖ Pay COA the medical liability insurance fee of **\$6.50**.

- ❖ Pay the supply fee of **\$25**.
- ❖ Submit a Continuing Education Registration Form. This form will be emailed to you after the application packet is accepted. Registrations can also be completed in the Workforce Development and Continuing Education offices at the Elizabeth City, Dare County, and Edenton campuses once the application is accepted.

This course introduces basic nursing skills required to provide personal care for patients, residents, or clients in a health care setting. Topics include communications, safety, patients' rights, personal care, vital signs, elimination, nutrition, emergencies, rehabilitation, CPR, and mental health. Upon successful completion of the course, the student is eligible to sit for the competency exam through PearsonVue for listing on the North Carolina Nurse Aide I Registry.

Basic Introduction to Computers (Edenton Campus) HRD-3005A 49599

Income Maintenance Caseworker NCFAST (Phase 1) HRD-4000A

This course covers skills and strategies designed to provide employability skills training and career exploration for the role of Income Maintenance Caseworker with the Division of Social Services agencies. This course is Phase 1 of a two-phase program. Students must complete and pass this phase before enrolling in Income Maintenance Caseworker Phase 2. Students are required to earn their National Career Readiness Certification (NCRC) as part of the course requirements. Fee waivers for the registration fee and the \$5 technology fee are available for qualifying individuals. During the last week of class, students will be required to pay a \$36 NCRC testing fee.

Income Maintenance Caseworker NCFAST (Phase 2)

This course is designed to cover a variety of skills associated with the Income Maintenance Caseworker role to determine service eligibility. Specific focus will include proficiency in the utilization of the NCFAST application. Other topics will include skills in communication, interviewing, time management, data gathering/compiling, and data analysis. This is Phase 2 of a two-phase program. Students must have taken Phase 1: Introduction to Human Services to be eligible for this course along with the CRC. In addition to the registration fee, a \$5 technology fee also applies to this class.
